Stop the Dawson gold mine

If we don't act quickly, a mining operation may soon **disrupt our tourism economy**, place our **river and drinking water at risk**, and create **dangerous fire hazards**—while leaving taxpaers with a potentially toxic waste pool to maintain and clean up if it contaminates our river.

Get the facts

- Mine site is just 1.5 miles from Cañon City limits, adjacent to Dawson Ranch, and visible from downtown.
- The **mine will operate 24/7** with ore trucks and industrial vehicles running frequently on Temple Canyon Rd., 1st St., and Hwy 50.
- 65,000,000 gallons of fresh groundwater will be pumped every year.
- A potentially **toxic tailings pond only 1,000 feet above Grape Creek**, feeding into the Arkansas River a half-mile upstream from the city's water treatment intake.
- There is **no plan to prevent or contain a wildfire** starting at the mine site.
- While some jobs may be created, **we're unlikely to see many local hires** because of the need for specific job skills.
- With only \$262k for reclamation, **taxpayers may wind up paying millions** of dollars to clean up the mine site once operations have stopped.
- The mine goes against the "Picture Cañon City 2040" vision and task force intended to protect our outdoor natural areas and recreational opportunities.
